The DNA of Musicals with Kevin and Joy Siddall

The British Musical– What's In Its DNA? The answer to that question, it turns out, is quite a bit from the American musical but with added British grit. Joy and Kevin Siddall entertained the monthly meeting with their excellent renditions of songs from the last 140 years of musical theatre. Starting with the very British Gilbert & Sullivan in the 1880s, they moved on with songs from "Oklahoma" to explain the huge influence of Rogers and Hammerstein in the 1940s and 50s. We then got to what they described as the first great British musical, Lionel Bart's "Oliver", followed by Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice's many successes. The duo finished their very enjoyable and informative show with Willy Russell's "Blood Brothers" where the grit I mentioned earlier
